This is the standard procedure with most journals. Specifically, this requires that the editorial office correctly identify a suitable handling academic editor if a manuscript does not have a cover letter addressed to a EB member. The EB members all have identified areas of expertise and so this process should be an easy task. Based on some manuscripts that have been sent to me for handling/review, I would say that currently this process is not as good as it could be.
